A READING FROM THE BOOK OF ISAIAH

From the Old Testament, Isaiah 2:1-5

This is what Isaiah, son of Amoz, saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come, the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills All nations shall stream toward it: many peoples shall come and say: "Come, let us climb the LORD's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths." They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again. 

SUNDAY OF THE FIRST WEEK OF ADVENT WHERE

At the time of Jesus, Nazareth was a tiny village in the hills twelve miles southwest of the Sea of Galilee. It was a small community of approximately 200 families, steeped in traditional Jewish culture in a world that had been radically influenced by Greek thought. With a total population of fewer than 500 people, it is easy to believe that everyone knew everyone, and everyone knew everything about everyone. Nazareth was small. It was unimportant in the eyes of the Romans, and it was inconsequential in the minds of many Jews.

Nazareth was where Joseph lived. We can imagine that the exterior realities of Nazareth helped shape the interior reality of Joseph. The simplicity of Nazareth nurtured the singular focus of Joseph's life, namely God. The humble poverty of Nazareth fostered the virtue of humility within Joseph's heart. The slow pace of Nazareth cultivated the contemplative rhythm of Joseph's life. Nazareth was more than where Joseph lived. Nazareth was where Joseph was. He was content with where he was because he was content with who he was.

It is important for us to consider the city of Nazareth, and all of her simplicities and imperfections, as the home God chose for Joseph. Why? Because many of us also find ourselves in imperfect families, imperfect seasons of life, and imperfect situations. Let us begin the journey by asking: How do you feel about "where" you are in life? Your life ... your marriage ... your vocation ... your family ... your health ... your job ... your past ... your dreams? How do you feel about "where" you are in life?


The temptation whispers like this: "If I were 'there' and not 'here', then I'd be happy." If I had another job, then I would be happy. If I could just be somewhere else or with someone else, then I would be happy. Reverently may I invite us to consider that our circumstances are important and to be honored; however, essentially what is important is to start with where God is. If God has led us to "where" we are, then our happiness will not come from the "place" we are. Happiness and fulfillment come from God. God was in Nazareth because that is where Joseph was. God is with you; therefore, God is "where" you are.

"Where" do you want to be by the end of Advent? What do you desire from the Lord from now to Christmas? If God could do anything in your life during this season of Advent, what would you want the Lord to do?

FOR YOUR PRAYER | Joseph prayed with the Psalms. Begin by slowly reading Psalm 46, especially verse 10. Read it a few times. Consider how often Joseph prayed with these Old Testament verses. What is God saying to you in the Bible passage? How does it apply to your life? What do you want to say to God?

TODAY'S PRAYER | "Father, I beg you to make this Advent my best ever. Help me to slow down, embrace the quiet, and to find you with me, no matter where I am."
