TODAY'S READINGS FROM THE BIBLE FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF THE PROPHET ISAIAH

From the Old Testament, Book of Isaiah 6:1-2A, 3-8

In the year King Uzziah died,
I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne, with the train of his garment filling the temple.
Seraphim were stationed above. They cried one to the other,
"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!"
At the sound of that cry, the frame of the door shook and the house was filled with smoke.
Then I said,
"Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips;
yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"
Then one of the seraphim flew to me, holding an ember that he had taken with tongs from the altar.

He touched my mouth with it, and said,
"See, now that this has touched your lips, your wickedness is removed, your sin purged."
Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying,
"Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?"
"Here I am," I said; "send me!"

that he was buried; that he was raised on the third day
in accordance with the Scriptures; that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve.
After that, he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at once,
most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep.
After that he appeared to James, then to all the apostles.
Last of all, as to one abnormally born, he appeared to me.
Therefore, whether it be I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE | *From the New Testament, Gospel of Luke 5:1-11*

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God,
he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake;
the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets.
Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon,
he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore.
Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.
After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon,
"Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch."
Simon said in reply,
"Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing,
but at your command I will lower the nets."
When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing.
They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them.
They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking.
When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said,
"Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man."
For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him,
and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon.
Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men."
When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.

HOMILY NOTES FOR SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 10 WEEK 1 OF THE SERIES

THIS WEEK | WEEK 1 | WHAT'S THE ONE THING WE NEED TO KNOW THIS WEEK? Jesus pulled Peter out of Simon. There's a Peter inside of every Simon. Jesus wants to pull the "Peter" out of your "Simon."

WHY DO WE NEED TO KNOW IT? God wants this more than you do. The burden is not on you, it's on God. You don't have to figure out "the way". God knows *how* your growth should happen. *God knows the way.*

WHAT ARE THE IMPLICATIONS IF WE DON'T UNDERSTAND THIS?

- One: We may believe that "this is as good as it gets". I want to be "a nice person" was never what God has intended for you.
- Two: We'll put too much pressure on ourselves.
- Three: We'll grasp at attempts for personal growth that will not bear the same fruit as God's way.

WHY IS GOD'S WAY THE WAY? THIS WEEK'S CORE MESSAGE: Jesus wants to pull the "Peter" out of your "Simon."

UNPACKING TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS FROM THE GOSPEL OF LUKE

NO. 1: PETER'S JOURNEY

- First, Simon [Peter] hears about Jesus from his brother Andrew. Then, from the beginning, Andrew introduces Simon to Jesus. From the first moment, Jesus sees Simon. Jesus knows Simon. And He already knows the Rock whom He's calling Simon to be.
- One of the two who heard John speak, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon, and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which means Christ). He brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him, and said, "So you are Simon the son of John? You shall be called Cephas" (which means Peter). (John 1:40-42)

NO. 2: SIMON AND JESUS

- He encounters Jesus again (probably more than once), even receiving Jesus into his own home. Maybe this Jesus is the Messiah? Surely, He has power which comes from God.
- And he arose and left the synagogue, and entered Simon's house. Now Simon's mother-in-law was ill with a high fever, and they asked him about her. 39 And he stood over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her; and immediately she rose and served them. (Luke 4:38-39)

NO. 3: SIMON'S BOAT

- Today, we hear of a deeply important encounter. Jesus teaches from Simon's boat. Then, having finished teaching, Jesus asks weary Simon for a little more. Simon, "put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." (Luke 5:4) He knows what Simon has inside of him. Jesus knows what grace He has given and will give to Simon. He pushes Simon a little past his comfort zone. He calls Peter out of Simon. Pay attention to how Luke uses Simon's name.
- And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." And when they had done this, they enclosed a great shoal of fish; and as their nets were breaking, they beckoned to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." For he was astonished, and all that were with him, at the catch of fish which they had taken; (Luke 5:5-9)
- "Simon's experience of a night of fruitless toil-catching nothing-would suggest to him that it is pointless to try again. Nonetheless, he obeys: at your command I will lower the nets. Simon is thus one of the first to listen to Jesus' words and act on them (see Luke 6:47). His response is one of trusting faith in Jesus' 'command' (literally, 'word'). Earlier in the Gospel, Mary accepted in faith the 'word' spoken to her by the angel (1:38). Now, Simon similarly accepts the 'word' of Jesus." (Fr. Pablo Gadness, *Catholic Commentary on Sacred Scripture: The Gospel of Luke*, pg. 110)

NO. 4: SIMON AND JESUS

- Simon had earlier recognized Jesus as the Messiah (at least partially). Simon had earlier recognized Jesus as a miracle worker. Now Simon recognizes Jesus as God. He takes a posture of prayer and confesses that Jesus is Lord (*kyrie*).
- "And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him." (Luke 5:11) Simon's encounters with Jesus change his life. He has made a fundamental choice to follow Jesus, and his actions prove it.

NO. 5: PULLING PETER OUT OF SIMON

- When Jesus first saw Simon, He saw Peter *in* Simon. When Jesus first saw the fisherman, He saw the Pope in the fisherman. Simon still has a long way to go. He still has much growing to do. God saw who Simon was. And, God saw who He was calling Simon to be.

NO. 6: THERE'S A "PETER" INSIDE EVERY "SIMON"

- If God can do that for Peter, imagine what God might do for you.
- Of course, you're asking "How?" Come back next week and we'll introduce you to the way how.

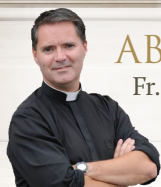

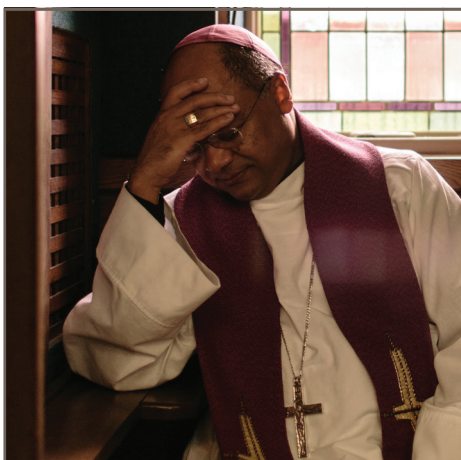
